Kintsugi: Beauty for brokenness

Beauty for brokenness, hope for despair,

Lord, in your suffering world this is our prayer.

The first two lines from a lovely hymn by Graham Kendrick.

Last month we thought a bit about Lament and Hope. This month Brokenness and Beauty. I think many of us are aware of our brokenness, in our bodies and our minds, as we encounter, as Rachel Mann puts it, "... the facts of loss, limit and fragility", in our lives.

Recently, I have found myself reading several articles about *Kintsugi*, which I think, has something to say to us about brokenness. Kintsugi is an ancient Japanese art form of repairing broken tea ware by resembling ceramic pieces, creating a new valuable pottery, which becomes more beautiful and more valuable than the original, unbroken vessel.

Kintsugi came out of the Japanese tea culture of the 16th century. One day, when Hosokawa, a tea master, was preparing tea for Hideyoshi, Hideyoshi's young attendant dropped an invaluable piece of tea ware, one of Hideyoshi's favourites, breaking it into five pieces. Hideyoshi raised his hand to punish the servant but Hosokawa intervened, by singing a poem. In Japanese culture, in the singing of this poem, Hosokawa atones for the young servant and takes the responsibility on to himself, saying, "I will be the one to be blamed for his mistake".

Hosokawa arranged for the five pieces of pottery to be reconnected using a Japanese technique, mixing resin with gold, and presented it to Hideyoshi, who was deeply moved by the beauty of the restored piece and the story became renowned. This act of compassion became the basis of Kintsugi, which adds gold in the cracks, creating a work of beauty through brokenness. The Japanese *kin* stands for 'gold' and *tsugi* means 'to reconnect'.

Kintsugi does not just fix or repair a broken vessel; rather, the technique makes the broken pottery even more beautiful and valuable than the original. Instead of hiding the repair, the brokenness becomes part of the aesthetic beauty. No two works will look the same or break in the same way. The golden scars tell a story.

This is a lovely illustration of how healing works. Jesus is the master of Kintsugi. His love is the golden resin. As the lives of Zacchaeus, Mary, Peter, Thomas, in the Bible and countless others in our world today, all testify, Jesus takes what is broken and puts it back together again in such a way that it becomes more beautiful and valuable than before. We do not need to hide our brokenness from God. We can offer our brokenness to Jesus and receive the golden resin and healing power of his love.

Brokenness is what teaches us to be fully human, to realise our interdependence, in some senses, it is the gift we offer to others because our wounds, our experiences of loss and brokenness, are what enable us to have compassion and bring that healing to others. Brokenness is also the place where, like in Lament, we often encounter God. The God who in Jesus, entered the brokenness of human existence and experience, so that he might bring us life in all its abundance.



THE LAMBING YARD

In the 1950s, when my brother was called up for his National Service, my father decided to change from farming cattle and to increase the sheep flock for lambs. When we first kept the lambing flock, we lambed them in a small paddock near the farm buildings. We would walk around them last thing at night and again about 2am or 3am in the morning with the Tilley lamp. We soon decided to make a lambing yard out of small bales of straw, making many small pens roofed with hurdles and more small bales, each big enough for one ewe and her lambs. This protected them from predators and mismothering from other ewes about to lamb.

Later, when we changed to big bales, we made some individual permanent pens made with planks sawn by a mobile sawmill. We used the pine trees blown down by the 1987 storm, which laid the trees like a field of wheat. We made one end of the pen of huts with a permanent structure and the rest of the yard with big bales about 100 x 40ft. This pen was kept well littered with straw - we had plenty. At lambing time, the ewes would be fed concentrates in a row of troughs down the middle of the yard. You soon learnt to put the feed in the troughs before the sheep came in -they were so keen to get to the food they would literally knock you over in the rush to get there first. The ewes were only in the yard at night, and by day they went out to feed on catch crops of kale or turnips or

cabbage. Any ewes that had lambed during the day were put in the small pens to prevent any mismothering. The sheep were Border Leicester cross with Cheviots.

It was much easier to look after them in the pens and saved a lot of lambs being eaten by foxes especially when there are twin or triplet lambs and the ewe has to have eyes everywhere. The yard also kept badgers away from ewes who were having trouble lambing. Badgers are opportunistic feeders and can take advantage of a ewe having difficulty with lambing. I have known cases of this when ewes sometimes get stuck on their backs and the badger will eat her udder which means she will have no milk for the probable twin or triplets

SHOREHAM VILLAGE SCHOOL NEWS

Although we did not manage to return to school after the Christmas break due to another Lockdown, the school has been open to families of Critical Workers and vulnerable pupils.

Online learning has been delivered to all age groups and we are offering three daily zoom lessons to provide structure to each family's day along with multiple opportunities for pupils to stay in touch with staff and their peers. Although we have high levels of pupil engagement, I don't know of any member of school staff who would not rather be in school working alongside pupils to support their learning, as something is definitely 'lost' over a screen.

That said, learning online and with limited resources has inspired pupils to be creative in different ways. Had we been at school, I would have delivered my topic on Indian Art in a fairly 'set' way, asking pupils to develop specific skills in each lesson through a medium of my choice. For example, when studying the architecture of the Taj Mahal, I may have asked for responses using watercolours or when observing lotus flowers in Indian culture, I may have developed pupils' origami skills. As the majority of pupils are at home and I do not know specifically what resources they have available to them I have given them the freedom to express their art in a medium of their choice - and this has been fascinating! I have seen lotus flower sculptures made from stale pita breads, elephants designed and sewn using scrap fabrics, Taj Mahals re-created in Minecraft and a close-up of an elephant eye made from a collage of buttons. How inventive, how truly creative – just what 'Art' is all about. In school, our curriculum plan is to teach pupils new skills and ensure they develop these by improving them lesson by lesson – which in itself can become quite prescriptive. It is therefore very refreshing for all of us to embrace new forms of media and to see the results of pupils exploring and developing their skills within these.

We have still been thinking about our community and we ran a poster challenge to encourage visitors to the village to treat it with respect and to take their rubbish home with them. We have also celebrated all lockdown birthdays with an online birthday cake making session where almost the whole school joined together to make a mug cake using basic ingredients in a microwave. This was a truly lovely event (unashamedly, it was held on my actual birthday) and the cakes were delicious too!

Finally, over February half term, the school had a fibre termination point installed and at some point, will have Fibre to the Premises (FTTP). Hopefully this will support the fibre laying plan that is being spearheaded by the Shoreham Parish Council Broadband Working Group.

SHOREHAM AGAINST FLY TIPPING

Fed up with fly-tipping blighting our Parish? Feel helpless to stop it? Here is YOUR chance to make a difference

Shoreham Parish Council are teaming up with the Sevenoaks District Council Environmental Enforcement Team to increase the chances of catching and prosecuting the offenders.

We need homeowners with CCTV, wildlife cameras and even doorbell cameras with either a direct or indirect view of the road, to come forward and form a Parish wide network.

Once we have the information of where cameras are located, their location will be plotted onto a map. If there is an incident reported, only the owners of the cameras in the vicinity will be contacted and given a time frame and any other relevant information, so that they can check their footage for evidence. This evidence will then be passed onto Enforcement to build a case to hopefully bring about a prosecution.

Many people post incidents of fly-tipping on social media sites such as Facebook and YouTube, this is not the place to get something done about it.

All fly-tipping incidents should be reported as soon as possible to Sevenoaks District Council by phoning **01732 227000** or go online and report it at www.sevenoaks.gov.uk and follow the REPORT link. Here you can upload pictures of the fly-tipping along with additional information.

Residents are understandably fed up with the present situation. If we work together, we should get fly-tipping cleared more efficiently and improve the chances of prosecuting the fly-tippers. They treat our roads as dumping grounds, put road users in danger, blight our countryside and cost innocent taxpayers money. Our network should discourage fly-tipping in the area and help prosecute those responsible.

We need those people who have cameras to come forward and build this network with us.
